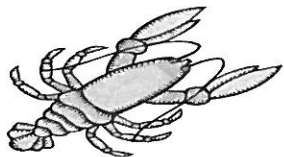


# LITTLE NECK NEWS

## Defibrillator News From Beau-

1. An AED (automated external defibrillator) and trauma kit with oxygen bottle have been purchased and installed for use on Little Neck. They are housed in a white glass fronted box on the outside back wall of the Community Center. Next time you go by take a look and familiarize yourself!
2. An AED is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses a potentially life threatening cardiac arrhythmia (heart attack). If no pulse is found it instructs the user to apply the device to help the heart reestablish an effective rhythm. The AED is designed to be simple to use by the layman. **It is used in combination with CPR.**
3. When you open the AED box, you will hear an alarm. This alarm is to discourage thieves. It does not call the fire department. **Always call 911 first in an emergency.**
4. Children must not tamper or play with the unit. If the unit is found to be tampered with the child's parents will be charged for a service call from the vendor.
5. If there is an emergency and the AED is needed it will be time consuming if whoever you send for the unit doesn't know where it is and what it is. A drill from your cottage to the unit and back will take 5 - 10 minutes and could save a life.  
**Make sure everyone in your**

## **cottage knows where the AED is**

**and what it looks like.** In the event of a heart attack time is of the essence.

6. It is our intention to remove the AED and Oxygen after Labor Day and put it in a year-round resident's cottage. Call Beau if you want to volunteer your cottage.
7. If the unit or first aid supplies are used please report it to the governor. We will need to have the kit replenished.
8. Post the flip side of this sheet on the refrigerator.

## WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

- ⊗ CALL 911
- ⊗ STATE: WHAT IS THE NATURE OF THE EMERGENCY ("My mother is unresponsive and has no pulse" or "My brother went under the water, we pulled him on shore but is not responsive.")
- ⊗ WHAT STREET ADDRESS AND TOWN (ex: "10 River Road, )
- ⊗ If you are alone, stay with the victim. For an unresponsive person, begin CPR.
- ⊗ if you can, alert someone to retrieve the AED. Do not stop CPR until the unit arrives for use on the victim.
- ⊗ Open the AED and push the start button.
