Both side doors flip up for chisel storage. Front door flips up and has a removable pull out tray. All secondary wood is walnut, inside lid two panels drop down for more storage. Applied For" and outside is an unreadable Co. name with "Chicago" at the bottom. Stanley Co. did make these pencil sharpener wood planes, but I'm unsure this is by Stanley. One side says "National Manufacturers/ Mutual Insurance Co./ Janesville, Wisconsin." The other side says "plane/ the cost of insurance is high/ our mutual policy shaves it down." Condition: good
